How – by participating in Debating Club; mix of formal lessons and fun and games

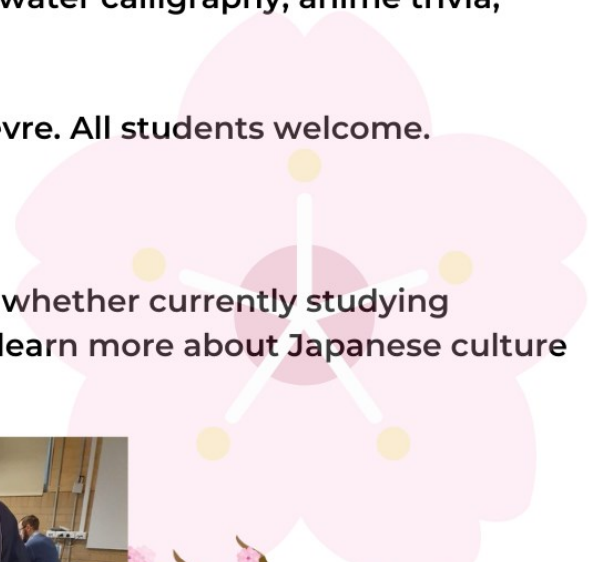
## Japanese Club.

## Farm Club



**Tuesday afternoon farm club 3-4pm: at the school farm from week 2 to week 9 of school term. Students need to have a permission note. Years 7-9**

This afternoon session is for the student who wants to learn more about farm work, who really enjoys caring for our poultry and sheep, and who has a developing interest in agriculture. Because the group is small there are many opportunities for students to learn about farm animals in much greater depth as well as checking on the orchard when it is getting close to harvest time. The group that comes on Tuesday afternoons assist with the overall care of the farm.



**Friday afternoon farm club 3-4pm at the school farm from week 2 to week 9 of school term. Students need to have a permission note. Years 7-9**

This program offers a social afternoon for a much larger group of students. We offer an afternoon tea and then we head off to the farm – to check the animals, feed them and spend time caring for them. Students get to know our chickens – especially the silkies – and feed our dorper sheep some treats. The afternoon offers social time on a small farm whilst getting to know more about the life and wellbeing of domesticated animals.



## Textile and Design Club

after school from 3pm-4pm Thursday afternoons week 2 to week 9 of school term. Permission note is needed. Years 7-10 Where: Textile and Design room – TAS faculty

This program offers students who are interested in textiles a creative space to make their own projects, to learn to sew, to design and make small gifts such as pillows, scrunchies, small bags. Students work independently using the school's textile equipment with the supervising teacher assisting their design ideas or helping them to learn new textile skills such as applique, pattern making and so on. It is also an important social space – textiles is a very social activity – so being with friends and making textile products together is a wonderful way to spend time together in the afternoon after school.
