# IMPORTANT NEWS FOR STUDENTS & PARENTS

### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

I would like to welcome all students, staff and parents & carers back to what will no doubt be another productive and enjoyable term at Quakers Hill High School. Term 2 is always a busy one, with course examinations and reporting taking place amongst the usual mix of school activities. It has been great to see students engaging with school so effectively after their holiday break.

#### HALF YEARLY EXAMINATIONS AND NAPLAN

Our examination period runs in Weeks 3 and 4 of this term. Timetables for the various papers have been distributed to students, as well as notifications detailing any specific arrangements. If any student cannot locate theirs, they should see their Year Adviser urgently for assistance. Students have been reminded of the school's SMART expectations in relation to assessments and examinations. Students must ensure that they come prepared, with all necessary equipment, for their examinations. If a student is absent for an examination, they must complete an illness/ misadventure form to explain it. Parents and carers are asked to take their child to the doctor if they are sick and request a medical certificate to substantiate their absence.

NAPLAN will take place for students in Years 7 and 9 during Week 4, beginning Tuesday 11 May. The schedule of NAPLAN tasks are included on examination timetables. It is important for students and their families to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing. Its purpose is to assess how students are progressing in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. NAPLAN results form part of the larger suite of evidence used by schools to plan for improvement. Please contact the school if you have any questions or concerns in relation to NAPLAN.

#### SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Our School Improvement Plan is now accessible through the school website. This plan charts a course for our ongoing development as a school and places students at the centre of all that we do. The School Improvement Plan now runs on a 4 year cycle of excellence, although will be revisited following the next external validation process, which is due in 2022. #### SPORT

On the last day of Term 1, Thursday 1 April, we held the annual Athletics Carnival. Participation on the day was very strong and a number of students achieved some excellent results. I would like to thank and recognise the organisers: Mr Hill, Mr Hawkes and Mr Nash, as well as all those who provided assistance to them. This is in addition to the staff who assisted on the day and of course the students who participated and engaged so wonderfully.

I would like to congratulate Kaleb Sciberras and Joshua Hand for their outstanding achievements in the Sydney West Swimming carnival held last Tuesday. Kaleb achieved a 3<sup>rd</sup> place in backstroke, which an excellent result. Joshua received 1<sup>st</sup> place in the 50m, 100m and 200m freestyle and 100m backstroke, as well as 2<sup>nd</sup> place in 100m butterfly and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in 100m breaststroke. These are truly outstanding results! Both boys have progressed to the Combined High Schools Championships.

The school Cross Country Carnival was held on Tuesday 27 April in the grounds of the school. This was a competitors only event and had a strong level of participation across the age groups. My thanks again to the organising staff – Mr Hill, Mr Hawkes and Mr Nash, as well as those who assisted. Thanks also to the competitors who took part and demonstrated excellent school spirit.

#### **DUKE OF EDINBURGH**

Our first Duke of Edinburgh expedition took place from Friday 23 April until Sunday 25 April and was an overwhelming success. This expedition catered for students attempting the Bronze award, who hiked over 2 days, and students attempting the Silver award who hiked for 3. The expedition was led by Ms Lawson Cohen and Mr Tomlinson, with Mr Head assisting with Bronze level students and ensuring their safe return home on Saturday. The Silver award students produced a moving video to commemorate Anzac Day, which can be viewed on the school Facebook page. I thoroughly recommend this. I would like to acknowledge the outstanding participation of all students on the hike and wish them all the best as they continue to progress through the program. I would also like to sincerely thank Ms Lawson Cohen, Mr Tomlinson and Mr Head for giving up their personal time to enable the hike to go ahead and for the leadership of the program at Quakers Hill High School. The Duke of Edinburgh Award is another example of the huge array of high quality experiences on offer for students at Quakers Hill High School.

#### ANZAC DAY

Quakers Hill High School commemorated Anzac Day with a ceremony on Monday 26 April. This was managed superbly by our SRC students, who highlighted the sacrifices of Australian service personnel across many theatres of war. The ceremony was held in the school quadrangle, which allowed students to view the flags at half mast as the Last Post was played and a +minute's silence observed. I would like to thank the SRC students involved as well as Mrs Critchley and her team of organisers who ensured the ceremony was authentic and expertly executed.



#### UNIFORM REMINDER

I would like to remind all families that as the cooler weather sets in, it is imperative that all students adhere to the school uniform policy at all times. Put simply, all students are expected to be in full school uniform every day.
